



Sensory Music

Sensory Music will be inspired by and based around one or more aspects of the terms theme. Sensory music will offer students to chance to respond to music and sounds and explore and play with different instruments. Students will get the chance to experience new sounds and communicate likes and dislikes. Music will be used to encourage engagement from students. Feeling vibrations and textures of instruments and watching movement from instruments will also be incorporated into the music activities. Sensory music will give students opportunities to explore sounds and instruments and test out sounds using their own bodies. E.g. vocalising or clapping. Sensory music will also allow students to experience changes in sound such as volume, tempo and rhythm.

Examples

Exploring sound vibrations through resonance board, rice on drums, tuning forks etc.
Make an instrument using a jar and rice or pasta, exploring the contents first.
